News From the Tax Collector's Office

Along with the colder weather, January brings Supplemental Motor Vehicle Tax Bills. These bills are for any motor vehicles that were registered between October 2, 2022 and September 30, 2023 and covers the months that you owned the vehicle. If you had transferred a plate from one vehicle to a new vehicle during this time period, you will see the credit on your tax bill for the months you did not have the old vehicle.



The third installment for real estate and personal property taxes, the second installment for sewer taxes, and supplemental motor vehicles are also due this month. You can pay your bills four different ways:

- You can mail in a check to PO Box 253, Brooklyn, CT 06234.
- You can pay online with a credit card (2.50% fees for a credit/debit card, \$3.95 fee for a Visa Debit Card ONLY, and \$2.00 for an electronic check). The same fees apply if using the card in office or over the phone.
- You can use the drop box located at the Town Hall.
- You can pay in the Tax Office.

The due dates for this year's taxes are: January 1st – February 1st

April 1st – May 1st





Assessor 860-779-3411 Option 6 Fax: 860-779-7853 4 Wolf Den Rd PO BOX 356 Supplemental Bills for the 2021 Motor Vehicle Grand List are due in January, 2023. You may be receiving a Supplemental bill because you did not receive a 2021 Motor Vehicle bill in July 2022 for a particular vehicle.

Assessment Increase Notices will be mailed within 10 days of the signing of the Grand List in January 2023. These notices apply to changes made to your property such as building permits, new homes, renovations, sheds, decks, pools, etc.



Personal Property Assessment Notices will be mailed in January 2023.



Deadline for Disabled Veteran's Proof: The deadline to file proof of your Veteran's Disability is March 31, 2023 for the 2022 Grand List.

Additional Veteran's Applications: The filing period begins February 1, 2023 and runs until October 1st, 2023. Proof of 2022 income required. ALL APPLICATIONS ARE BY MAIL OR OUR DROP OFF BOX.

Elderly and/or Disabled Homeowners: Filing period begins February 1, 2023 and runs until May 15, 2023. Please Note: The Town Hall is closed on Fridays. APPLICATIONS ARE BY MAIL, BY USING OUR DROP OFF BOX OR CALL FOR AN APPOINTMENT.

To be eligible for this tax credit:

You or your spouse must be at least 65 years of age as of December 31, 2022 or over the age of 18 and permanently disabled per Social Security.

You must be a permanent resident of Connecticut. You must own the property or hold tenancy for life or for a term of years, which makes the applicant liable for payment of taxes (CGS Sec. 12-48) as of October 1, 2022. The property must be the applicant's primary residence (domicile). Your 2022 income cannot exceed \$49,100 if you are married or \$40,300 if you are unmarried. You must provide the Assessor with a copy of your SSA 1099 for 2022, or its equivalent, from Social Security and your 2022 Federal Income tax return if you were required to file. And any other interest/dividend statements and pension statements, all for 2022.



Board of Assessment Appeals: Applications for Board of Assessment Appeals must be filed by February 20, 2023 for Real Estate and/or Supplemental Motor Vehicle. Forms are available on our website at www.brooklynct.org from the Assessor's Department. BAA is scheduled to meet Thursday March 9, 2023 & March 13, 2023 if needed.

Ever wonder what goes on in the Town Clerk's Office?

The Clerk's office is one of the most visited offices in the Town Hall. Daily, we see residents, attorneys,

You probably know that the Clerk's office holds all the land records in town. But what does that mean? Every day, different types of documents are recorded on the land records for properties in town. This includes deeds, mortgages, liens, releases, maps, and many more. Think of all the properties in town and you can imagine the volume of records that come across our desks! Land records are kept forever and in our vault we have records dating back to 1786. All our land records are open to the public so feel free to stop in and take a look!

Our second largest collection of records is our Vital Records collection. If you were born, married or died in Brooklyn, a record of the event will be in our vault. If you lived in Brooklyn at the time you were married or passed away, but the event occurred in another town in CT, we will have a resident copy of that vital record. If your mother was living in Brooklyn at the time of your birth, we'll have that record as well. Certified copies of vital records can be obtained at any time from either the Town Clerk or the Assistant Town Clerk, both of whom are sworn-in Registrars of Vital Statistics appointed by the State. We also offer a way to request and pay for your vital record on our website at www.brooklynct.org.



The busiest month of the year in the Clerk's office is June—Dog License month! Did you know that by state statute, any dog over six months of age must be registered with the Town Clerk? Dog licenses renew every June and we'll process over 400 renewals throughout the month! The process is simple, bring your dog's up-to-date rabies certificate to the Clerk's office (along with a copy of the spay/neuter certificate if that applies), pay the fee and we'll give you a dog tag. If you find a lost dog that has a Town of Brooklyn tag on its collar, please call us so we can help locate its owner! Last year we partnered with our Dog license company to offer a way to renew your dog's license online, check it out at www.brooklynct.org.

Need to register to vote? Can't make it to the polls on election day and need an absentee ballot? The Clerk's office can help you! We have voter cards in our office that you can fill out anytime. We also process all absentee ballots for elections, primaries and referendums. During the 2020 Presidential election, we processed over 1200 absentee ballots! If you have a question about any election-related item, chances are the Clerks can answer it for you.

Fishing season starts in April! Get your fishing & hunting licenses and permits in the Clerk's office. Remember, if you're over 65, the licenses are free!

There are many miscellaneous duties the Clerk's office can help you with. If you need a Notary, both the Town Clerk and the Assistant are Notaries Public. Our office records all Trade Name Certificates for those individuals doing business in town. We record copies of liquor permits, and index Notary Public registrations. We hold the meeting minutes and agendas for all Boards and Commissions. The Clerk takes the minutes at all town meetings and we maintain the Town Meeting book in our vault. Veteran's Discharges (DD-214s) are indexed and kept in our vault for the Assessor's tax exemption requirements. We also perform bi-weekly, monthly, quarterly and yearly administrative and clerical duties.

We hope this helps you, as a resident, understand what goes on in the Clerk's office on any given day. Please feel free to stop in anytime.

August 9, 2022 Primary

Voters chose candidates to represent the Democratic and Republican parties in anticipation of the General election on November 8, 2022. There were 2679 total eligible voters. 352 voted (13% turnout); 343 in-person; 9 absentee. Broken down further, 1297 total eligible Democrats; 128 Democrats voted (9.87% turnout); 119 in-person votes and 9 absentee votes. 1382 total eligible Republicans; 224 Republicans voted (16.2% turnout); 224 in-person and 0 absentee votes.

November 8, 2022 General Election

There were 5391 total eligible voters. 3,236 voted (60% turnout); 2,944 in-person; 292 absentee.



Up-Coming Events-Beginning in 2023

CANVASS: Registrars will conduct the annual canvass beginning in January and ending on April 30, 2023. The purpose of this activity is to update existing voter records as well as to purge voter registrations for those voters who have either moved out of the town and/or state or have not voted within the last 4 years. If you are a registered voter in Brooklyn and receive our canvass mailing, please review the documents, and return the canvass notice back to the Registrars with any changes and/or corrections noted so that you will not be removed from the Active Voter List.

Once the installation is complete an inspection is required by the Building Official, John Berard. Please contact the office at 860-779-3411 Extension 12 to set up an inspection date. The Building's Official's schedule fills up fast, please plan accordingly.

Town Ordinance 8-2 Withholding Approval of a Building Application When Taxes are Delinquent:

- A. Pursuant to the authority of Public Act 95-320, it will be the policy of the Town to withhold approval of building applications when taxes are delinquent for the property for which an application is made.
- B. *Waiver*. In the event that a taxpayer seeking an application is contesting the underlying tax assessment, or in cases of unusual hardship, the Board of Selectmen may waive the denial of approval set forth in this section.
- C. (Ord. No. 95-1 State Statute 1)

The Building Department is in the process of streamlining the inspection process, details to follow in the Spring Newsletter.
